

# The Village of Suamico 2011 Resident Strategic Plan Survey Written Responses



The Village of Suamico has begun developing a strategic plan for 2012-2014 that will outline the primary objectives that the Village will work to accomplish by 2014. Throughout the process the Village Board has taken initiatives to integrate citizen feedback and perspective into the plan through the distribution of two community surveys; one sent to local business owners/managers and a community wide survey in the 2011 second quarterly newsletter. Approximately 4,277 Resident surveys were distributed with 537 responding for a return rate of 12.56%. The Resident survey included questions that asked residents to give further insight into specifics of these potential projects. The following are the written responses of local residents regarding aspects of the strategic plan.

\*Please note: These responses have been typed exactly how they were on the survey with only minor grammatical or spelling corrections. Each question includes the column “Survey #” which specifies which survey the response came from. If there is a question or need to look at a particular survey this will allow staff to find the corresponding document. The surveys have been numbered but no personal information has been included to identify the resident; all residents have remained anonymous.
